General Structure:

In this section for the advantages and disadvantages essay we will look at typical structures, DO's and DON'Ts and examples to help you maximize your answer to such a question.

What is the overall structure of an advantages and disadvantages essay?

Format 1

Introduction

Paragraph one = (usually two) advantages OR disadvantages (usually two)

Paragraph two = disadvantages OR advantages

Conclusion = summarize

Format 2

Introduction

Paragraph one = advantages AND disadvantages

Paragraph two = advantages AND disadvantages

Conclusion = summarize

Which one should I choose?

If you have advantages and disadvantages that match each other, you can choose the first or the second one. If one or more of the advantages do not match the disadvantages, then the first one is more logical.

Generally follow the IELTS criteria advice: "Organize logically" as you see best.

Why should I choose two advantages and two disadvantages and not more or less?

To get a maximum 9, you need to fully support your ideas. The size of the essay allows you to support two ideas, or in this case two advantages, in a pargraph but not more. You can have 3 advantages if they are all supported. This might be possible if two of them are connected somehow.

What should I do and what should I not do in an advantages / disadvantages essay?

DO

- show in the introduction that the essay will discuss advantages and disadvantages
- paraphrase the words in the statement (advantages / benefits)
- connect the language of your introduction to the specific question

DON'T

- talk about whether advantages or disadvantages are more
- give advice on how to make things better
- give your opinion of how good or bad the situation is

MANY candidates who should get an 8/9 for TA get a 6 because they do one or more of these "DON'Ts"

As well as these "DO's" and "DON'Ts" we can add the two following

TRY TO

• give a summary or signal in the introduciton of ideas to come later (without detailing them)

AVOID

using long structures that are not specific to the particular question

The reason why these two are not in the "DO's" and "DON'Ts" is that if you don't give a signal or if you do use long structures not specific to the exam task, it is not automatically bad

You can come across different cultural dress and try different national cuisine. Such experience often helps broaden people's horizons and appreciate life more. The second plus is that for some the holiday feels like a greater break. Most people would agree that, as you have experienced such new things, you are more likely to return with more fully recharged batteries than if you had holidayed within your country.

When discussing the disadvantages, many would say that cost is one of the main ones. Generally speaking, a trip overseas will cost more due to factors such as greater plane ticket costs and visa fees. It is no suprise that in times of economic difficulty, the overseas tourist sector drops more than average. Another downside is possible stress to the person traveling. Although, as mentioned above, there are those who feel refreshed by new cultural experiences, for others a trip overseas is not as relaxing for the nervous system, particularly if you need to operate in an environment where the language is not familiar to you.

In conclusion, the benefits are discovering new cultures and feeling more refreshed after such a holiday. The disadvantages are the cost and possible stress involved.

Answer:

It does everything successfully, except the "TRY TO" (give a signal in the introduction of ideas to come later without detailing them). It is not a problem if an essay does not have any such signals / summaries.

c) As you can see from the previous exercise, it is not difficult to "put together" an advantages and disadvantages essay using the generic structure. This means a lot of candidates produce essays that have similar structures.

In order to make your essay "different", you should, as said before,

- in the introduction try to give a signal of ideas to come later (without detailing them)
- avoid using long structures that are not specific to the particular question

Below are two alternative introductions to the same essay as before. As you read:

- highlight the words that are specific to the topic / are a "signal" of the ideas to come
- choose which one is better

Answer:

Note: it is <u>NOT</u> necessary to introduce your arguments in the introduction. It is fine to introduce them later in the body, then develop them, then summarize in the conclusion. It is not appropriate to extend the introduction **too much** listing the arguments. For this reason, the first introduction Is better. Only a small amount of words are added to give the specific ideas of what is to come later, **and** these words are included **naturally** in the opening statement.

Twice as many are added in the second introduction. Firstly, this means it is now too long. The essay would need to be almost 400 words to balance it. Secondly, and just as importantly, it means there will be repetition later in the essay as the arguments are introduced a second time.

Can I keep the conclusion / introduction shorter if I have timing difficulties?

Yes. Time is an important consideration. Below are two conclusions: the previous one and a longer alternative. Although the alternative is better, the first one is fine. If you do not have much time or do not know how to summarize well without repeating at length, use it.

- 1. In conclusion, the benefits are discovering new cultures and feeling more refreshed after such a holiday. The disadvantages are the cost and possible stress involved.
- 2. In conclusion, the main benefits to a person traveling overseas are discovery of other cultures and renewal from exposure to the unfamiliar. The main disadantage is the increased cost, and, for some, another could downside could be stress.

Example Answer Two: Advantages and Disadvantages (of a solution)

- a) Read the exam task, think of **your** ideas, and answer the following questions
 - What are the specific "parts" (as opposed to the general idea)?
 - What "essay" position is asked for?

In order to solve traffic problems, governments should tax private car owners heavily and use the money to improve public transportation.

What are the advantages and disadvantages of such a solution?

Give reasons for your answer and include any relevant examples from your own experience or knowledge.

Some people believe that to solve them, the government ought to make public transport better with money raised by placing a heavy tax on owners of private cars. The benefits and drawbacks of such an idea will be discussed in this essay.

Beginning with the advantages, most people would agree that owners of private cars are one of the primary causes of problems with traffic. So discouraging private owners from driving via a tax would go a long way to fixing such problems. This would increase the likelihood of people switching to public transport, thereby decreasing traffic problems.

The first disadvantage of such a solution is the use of not just a tax but a heavy. Secondly, even assuming the government in question passed such a tax, we cannot say for sure that people will change to public transport. There is some chance that drivers will not want to use public transport even if it is better, and the money would be better spent on improving road infrastructure to help resolve traffic issues.

In conclusion, the advantages of the solution are that it might both discourage people from driving and encourage use of public transport means. The downsides are its likely polical unpopularity and assumption of how best to use the raised funds.

Answers:

- 1) If the issues are "unsolvable" how can they be "overcome"?
- 2) "rocketing" is too strong for this context. Issues with traffic hardly ever, if ever, "rocket".
- 3) We don't "crack down" of traffic issues.
- 4) we don't "renovate" public transport. If you use, for example, a google search "renovate public transport", you will see that the results are from the Ivory Coast, Iran, Armenia, Russia, Venezuela websites. So in these places perhaps they say "renovate public transport", but not in native English-speaking countries.
- 5) "pondered" is not appropriate for an essay
